2. Inadequate education, experience, and training of mental health counselors and program leaders.
3. Inadequate supervision of mental health counselors.
4. Inadequate individual and group therapy provided by counselors.
5. Inadequate space for group and individual therapy services.
6. Inadequate confidential settings for individual therapy.
7. Inadequate psychiatric services and continuity of care.
8. Inadequate medication management.
9. Inappropriate reliance on medication to manage mentally ill inmates rather than therapeutic activities.
10. Inadequate screening for mental health problems in R&E.
11. Inadequate services for inmates assigned to ICS.
12. Inadequate services for inmates hospitalized in Gilliam Psychiatric Hospital.
13. Inadequate services provided to female mentally ill inmates.
14. Inadequate services provided to inmates in crisis intervention.
15. Inadequate suicide prevention program.
16. Inadequate training for correctional officers.
